

## Sexual Violence Against Black & African American Women

- 1 in 4 Black girls will be sexually abused before the age of 18.1
- 1 in 5 Black women are survivors of rape.<sup>1</sup>
- 35% of Black women experienced some form of contact of sexual violence during their lifetime.1
- 40-60% of Black women report being subjected to coercive sexual contact by age 18.1
- 17% of Black women experienced sexual violence other than rape by an intimate partner during their lifetime.1
- In a two-year review done by the FBI of all suspected human trafficking incidents, 40% of victims of sex trafficking were African American.
  - o African American children comprise 53% of child prostitution arrests.<sup>2</sup>
    - Note: "Child Prostitution" is a legal definition; child prostitution is human sex trafficking.
- Black women experience significantly higher rates of psychological abuse—including humiliation, insults, name-calling, and coercive control—than do women overall.<sup>2</sup>
- A 2015 survey of Black Transwomen found that 53% have experienced sexual violence.<sup>3</sup>
- Nearly half of all Black/African/African American transgender people, 47%, have been incarcerated, and incarcerated transgender individuals are 10x as likely to be sexually assaulted by their fellow inmates, and 5x as likely to be sexually assaulted by staff.<sup>4,5</sup>
- More than 20% of Black Women are raped during their lifetimes—a higher share among women overall.4
- According to the U.S. Department of Justice Bureau, between the years 2005 and 2010, African American girls 12 years old and older experienced higher rates of rape and sexual assault than White, Asian, and Latina girls and women.<sup>6</sup>
